## Now Hear This

Today's leaf blowers are quieter than ever, but you still need to protect your hearing.

Keep these tips in mind when shopping for noise-canceling earmuffs.

1. Choose an earmuff that cancels a wide range of noise frequencies. Lawn mowers, leaf blowers, and the like produce low-frequency noise.
2. Some earmuffs include an audio input feature, which allows you to listen to your favorite music while mowing or leaf blowing.
3. Try on several options before you settle on one. Some headbands are tighter than others; some cushions, softer. Get a comfortable pair, and you'll be sure to wear them. —Eds
